Air Conditioning Special Assessment: Please Vote on Oct 6th

Around the middle of August all THA members received a post card providing notice of a special meeting at the Club House at 7:30pm on Wednesday, October 6th. As discussed in our article for the July Trails, the purpose of the meeting will be to vote on whether to establish a special assessment of \$50/lot for next year to help finance the cost of installing air conditioning in the club house.

As you may recall, the community voted at the June 17th special meeting to spend \$20,000 from our reserve fund to install air conditioning in the Club House. At that meeting numerous members urged that this cost be paid through a special assessment, rather than a \$20,000 self loan from our reserve fund. It was suggested that a special assessment assures greater protection of our reserve fund and is a more financially prudent way to proceed. Please review the Board's article in the July Trails discussing the reasoning behind the special meeting on October 6th.

The Board urges the community to vote YES, in person or by proxy.

A special assessment will put less stress on our reserve fund. In this regard it is important to note that each year we set aside around \$50,000 to \$60,000 in our accounts to pay for the replacement and repair of our existing facilities, plus repay a portion of the existing self loan of \$100,000 for the recent club house addition. This "set aside" accumulates over the years in our accounts, and we refer to this "set aside" as our reserve fund. The amounts dedicated to the fund are calculated on the basis of replacing existing facilities. When we take out a \$20,000 self loan, we must set aside over the years sufficient funds not only to repay the loan, but also to address future contingencies, planned or unplanned. The amount of money needed to repay the loan will also be reflected in future THA assessments, TCC dues, club house rental fees, and our annual budgets. For a more detailed discussion of our reserve fund strategy, please review the budget article prepared by the Board in November 2009 Trails.

Please note that you can vote by simply marking and signing the post card proxy and dropping it off in the

Community Center mail box. For those wishing to vote in person, the meeting starts at 7:30pm, at which time the remainder of the votes will be cast and counted. No other business will be transacted at the meeting.



Truro Homes Association Board of Directors Meeting, 8/11/10

Call to order 6:30pm. Meeting was held at Dave Watts' house due to the temperature. Members present: Dave Watts, Hamp Oberle, Lynn Daft, Marion Yanick and Ray Luckenbach (Parkland Committee).

1. **Open forum for comments**, questions, and communications from THA and TCC members: no members presented comments.
2. The Board approved the minutes of the July meeting as published in the *Truro Trails*.

COMMITTEES

1. **Parkland:** Ray Luckenbach presented the Parklands evaluation of the contractors' RFP responses to repair London Bridge. It was their recommendation that Stafford Systems, Inc submitted the best bid to satisfy the scope of work. The Board voted to award the contract for repair to Stafford Systems in the amount of \$13,959.00.
2. **Pool:** The awning that was damaged by winds is scheduled for repair at a cost of \$1,400.00. The awning fabric is new and the cost of a new awning system is approximately \$5,000. The Board agreed to fix the existing awning. Parts have been ordered.
3. The pool motor had to be replaced due to water damage. The sump pump could not stay ahead of the excessive water from the recent rains that flooded the pump housing well. NV will install a larger sump pump to be submerged in the concrete flooring of the well.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. **Air conditioning Special Assessment:** Dave Watts will write an article for the September *Truro Trails*

to provide explanation of the air conditioning Special Assessment meeting on October 5, 2010.

2. **Pool Drainage Issues:** Marion Yanick presented two bids for addressing the water drainage problems at the pool. The contract was awarded to Sumter Construction in the amount of \$ 11,950.00. Sumter offered a discount of \$225 if all three phases of the project were done consecutively. The Board approved and the contract price adjusted to \$11,725.00. Marion Yanick and/or Don Johnson will have project oversight.
3. **Parking Lot Project:** A RFP to repair the lower parking lot and patches of the lot by the trash bin areas will be let out at the end of August. Don Johnson will have project oversight.

NEW BUSINESS

1. **The September issue of the *Trails*** will now be in an electronic format retrievable from the website. Those who requested a paper copy will still receive one.
2. **Collection process for TCC and THA:** Lawyers approved Truro's plan for the collection of the THA and TCC assessments to be adopted into the book of resolutions.
3. **Cracker Jack Dive Meet:** The NVSL sent a thank you letter to Truro expressing their gratitude for hosting this year's meet. The Board has asked the NVSL to seek another facility to host the event for the 2011 season. The Board will be discussing with the dive team representatives alternative locations for next year's meet, as the event, as now organized, is too big for our facility and exceeds our pool capacity.

Next Board Meeting is **Thursday, September 16, 2010** at 6:30pm in the clubhouse.

Meeting adjourned at 7:45pm.

SIX Consecutive Years as Division One NVSL Champions; 12 Over All Since 1996

I am thankful to report that this summer was an amazing summer for diving at Truro Pool. I know you have seen the kids practicing morning, noon, night, and on the weekends. You can be proud of your Truro divers because they have

been learning the values of what hard work, dedication, commitment, and loyalty, are all about. Every day I have worked with the divers to motivate, challenge, and inspire, them to want to work as hard as they can so they can be the best that they can be.

All but a handful of our divers are pure summer divers. That means that they are not diving during the fall, winter, and spring, months at an indoor pool. Each summer the kids anxiously look forward to the pool opening and then they get on the diving boards to start up the process all over again. And each summer I can tell that we will have a heck of a lot of work to do just to get up to Truro standards. When you observe the team practices you will see that all of the kids practice together side by side: The young 5 year olds are there diving and talking with the 16 & 17 year olds. Often times I have the older kids working with the younger kids teaching them how to properly do the approaches, or how to do a front dive off the side of the pool, or a forward somersault off of the tumbling mats. When all of the kids are there it sometimes creates for long lines, but this way all of the kids get to know one another. And when all of the kids know one another they cheer for one another. This would happen often during all of the practices throughout the summer. The team bonding this summer was nothing short of inspiring. I was humbled to be a part of it.

I know many of you Truro patrons have seen the divers working and playing hard. Many of you would come up to me and give me some words of encouragement or you would want to know how the team was doing. I am humbled to report to you the following results:

At the conclusion at some of the meets some of our parents would hear the other team parents talking amongst themselves, saying, "I thought the meet was going to be so much closer." The truth is...so did we. But each meet I tell the divers that we can never, ever, underestimate our opponents. Each week we have to do everything that is humanly possible to prepare and to be ready. If we do everything we can to be prepared and we still lose, then we can still hold our heads up high and go and congratulate our opponents knowing that we didn't leave anything to chance.
