New Truro Street Names Proposed – Others No Longer Popular

In the June 2000 issue of the *Truro Trails*, it was reported that new street names were being approved by VDOT for 90% of the streets in the Truro neighborhood. Some residents were up in arms about this, so the THA Board went into Executive session at the time and decided to wait 13 years to see if the names that were chosen would still be popular. How smart they were! Brittney Spears Lane, Elizabeth Hurley Way, 98 Degrees Court and N'Synch Lane are no longer popular names. Who are these people? Some newer and more common/classic names were discussed and will be voted on at the May General Membership Meeting.

A VDOT official who is familiar with the situation but must remain anonymous due to the sensitivity of the issue stated, "The names will be changing, and the signs will also be a little brighter than they are now. Lime Glow Green has been approved as the new color of the street signs in Truro so that people can see them better at night. The signs will actually glow in the dark!"

The safety of community members was another proposed reason for the change. A spokesperson for the county added, "The children, new teen drivers and folks who are losing their eyesight will be safer while driving due to these name changes because they will be able to remember the street names, see them better, and thus find their way home easier if they were to become lost."

THA Board of Directors Meeting, March 13, 2013

Call to order at 6:30pm. Members present: Hamp Oberle, Sue Chandler, Marion Yanick, Lynn Daft. Also present: Chuck Roper (Treasurer), Dave Curtis (Parkland).

Open forum for comments and questions from THA and TCC members: no members present.

1. The board approved the minutes of the February board meeting as published in the March *Truro Trails*.
2. Treasurer's Report: As of 3/12/13 total assets equaled \$318,920.
3. Committee Reports:
 - Parkland-** Dave Curtis. Our spring Parkland Cleanup Day will be on Sat, Apr. 20, and there will be a Bird Walk on April 14 (7:30am @ club house). Dave also reported that he approached Wakefield Chapel Woods HOA parkland board about splitting the cost for a planned survey of the THA area that abuts WCW and the property of several non-THA homeowners. They declined to spend the money but allowed us to stake out the boundary.
 - Pool** - Marion Yanick reported that work on the concrete is still in progress. The contractor is waiting for good weather to finish the job. Also, there has been ground water leakage on the lower level in the club house. The board has decided to contract with All Aspects to build a water drainage system to solve the problem. The project, which is slated to start on March 25th, will cost \$6,420.

OLD BUSINESS

1. **Stream bed:** We are still awaiting the final decision from Fairfax County.
2. **Status of ADA compliance, pool access, and baby pool.** Marion Yanick reported on an open meeting held by THA lawyers for their HOA clients about ADA compliance for their community pools. We are compliant, except for baby pool, which will require a beach ramp. At the moment, pools have to be able to show that they are working toward compliance. Marion is meeting with NV Pools to discuss possibilities.

NEW BUSINESS

1. **Swim and Dive:** Marion, Dave Watts and Chuck Roper will meet with swim and dive reps on March 19 to discuss financial recording measures that the auditors have requested from Truro.
2. **Truro Lifetime Achievement Award:** Bill Ullman has been chosen to receive the Truro Lifetime Achievement Award. The board congratulates and thanks Bill for his tireless work for our community.
3. The board approved the use of the parking lot for the beginning and end of **Marlee's Walk** on Sunday, April 21st at 9:00am in memory of Marlee Treger.
4. The board approved the expenditure of \$50 for the Men's tennis membership fee in the NVTL for 2013.
5. April board meeting: Wednesday, April 10 at 6:30.

Meeting adjourned at 8pm.

5th Annual Parkland Bird Walk

For the 5th straight year, we can learn more about the birds in our parkland. Truro resident Al Goetz will again lead an early morning walk through our parkland to help us recognize the birds in our area both by sight and sound.

According to Al, rufous-sided towhee, Carolina wren, cardinal, tufted titmouse, chickadee, house finch, white-breasted nuthatch, northern flicker, pileated and downy woodpeckers, robin, song sparrow, wood thrush, and house wren would be among those birds that participants might be able to see and hear during the walk. Early spring migrants such as eastern phoebe may also be calling.

Al has been birding for over 40 years and has traveled extensively to see the birds of Costa Rica and Ecuador (several times) and to the Mideast, Africa, Brazil, Mexico, Belize, and Trinidad. During his 7 years as a Truro Resident, he has recorded 49 species on his "yard list" of birds. He can recognize by voice all the birds typically found in the parkland, and his goal for this walk is to help others be able to identify by voice a number of birds as well.

Before moving to Truro, Al had a 36 year career as a high school mathematics teacher. In his day job, Al is senior journal editor for the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics but he also serves as an adjunct professor at George Mason University and does some math tutoring for Truro residents.

Join Al Goetz for this early morning walk through our parkland. This event will take place rain or shine. Bring your binoculars to enhance the experience.

I am happy to report that the board has not only approved the Truro Snack Bar again this summer, but we will also be expanding our operations. **This year we will run the snack bar 7 days a week** (except when swim and dive concessions are running, or the clubhouse is being used for a function) and will be opening earlier so that kids can get food or drinks after swim and dive practice (last year it opened at 2pm, and only on weekends).

Aimed at everyman, and not the artist, Stoeke's talk about creative flow will inspire you to reconsider your own interest in the meaning of artistic expression.

Janet Stoeke knows precisely how hard it is to carve out time for creativity. As a busy mother of four, she has published 25 books for children, selling well over a million copies and garnering numerous national awards. Her series about the silly mixed-up hen, Minerva Louise, has been in print for over 25 years, and remains a staple in libraries across the country and around the world. Stoeke holds a master's degree in painting from George Washington University and has taught illustration at the Corcoran College of Art and Design. She lives just a few doors up from the pool.
